See Us Now - Youth Survey Responses February 2019




Metro Dallas Homeless Alliance (MDHA) conducts an annual Point in Time count of those experiencing homelessness in Dallas County, in accordance with requirements from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. In 2018, MDHA's Youth Committee began a co-occurring outreach event for youth experiencing homelessness in which youth are asked to express their own voices through formal surveys administered by volunteers around Dallas and Collin counties.














Highest Level of Education






Respondent Ever Had a Child





Where Respondents Slept "Last Night"

























